






Project Location

From Rock Quarry Road To Berkeley Lake Road Including the Realignment Of Pearl Road





Existing Conditions

- 2-lane rural section
- Some improved areas from developments
- Lacking bike/ped facilities





Purpose of Project

- Realign Pearl Road intersection with Rock Quarry Road
- Provide designated turn lanes
- Add bike/ped facilities





Typical Section

- 2-lane median divided
- 10' multiuse path on West side
- 6' sidewalk on East side





Project Challenges

- Pearl Road Realignment
- Pedestrian & Bike crossings of Barwell Rd (HAWK)
- Subdivision entrances







Stormwater Design

- Extra precautions required for stormwater runoff as project located in sensitive Neuse River Basin
- 3 bioretention basins to be included along Barwell Road to collect and treat stormwater run-off from the roadway corridor before draining offsite









Traffic Control Plan

- Traffic on Barwell Rd. to be maintained for the duration of the project using flaggers
- Pearl Rd. realignment to be completed away from traffic and using local detour
